2022 ANNUAL REPORT

STAR shined bright as we delivered services to children and adults with physical, neurological and mental disabilities, youth and women considered at-risk, veterans with physical issues and/or PTSD and seniors with Alzheimer's or dementia. We accomplished this through our Changing STRIDES, Equine-assisted learning, Heroes & Horses, Mini's in Motion, Reflections, Stable Friends and Therapeutic Riding programs.

Our **452** volunteers provided a total of **15,221** hours of service with **34** equines, and **20** staff to empower **1,522** individuals from our community to be stronger in mind, body, and spirit. The Minis in Motion program engaged **744** people during their visits to memory care facilities and school programs.

In 2022 the Reflection program, which serves individuals with early and middle-stage Alzheimer's and their caregivers, grew 32%.


We've Got Hay

We were able to put up 2,325 bales of hay, which equated to a savings of over \$18K. All while providing our horses with quality and nutritious forage.


Helping Our Heroes
